- Exams fees are charged separately by the assigned examiner.

NOTE: Also, In special cases, some employers can take you after a successful A2 or B1 Level.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Note: If any documents below are missing, we shall not attend to you. Make sure you attach all!

1. Complete the application form on our website or apply via e-mail address on the "CONTACT US" below. Attach and submit the required documents (CV, and academic qualifications). Stating the kind of job of interest in Germany.
2. You will receive admission letter.
3. Then attend a meeting with our Germany based team/advisors.
4. Then make payments to join the class.
5. Attend an orientation session.
6. Begin your language course.

VISA APPLICATION PROCESS

Applying from Zambia through the German Embassy in Lusaka involves:

1. Gather Required Documents:
 - a. Valid passport
 - b. Visa application form
 - c. Language course registration proof
 - d. Academic and professional qualifications
 - e. Employer's contract
2. Schedule an Appointment: Book an appointment via the German Embassy website.
3. Attend the Visa Interview: Bring all original documents for verification.
4. Await Visa Decision: Waiting duration will be communicated to you by the embassy VISA department.
